Horizontal Reservation

The above vacancies shall be governed by the following Government Orders for the implementation of horizontal reservation:

1. G.O. Ms. No. 77, General Administration (Services-D) Department, dated 02.08.2023
2. G.O. Ms. No. 46, dated 19.04.2025
3. Sports Policy of the Government of Andhra Pradesh issued vide G.O. Ms. No. 04, YAT&C (Sports & Youth Services) Department, dated 19.04.2025, read with G.O. Important Notes on Reservation

1. As per the Andhra Pradesh Gazette Notification No. 19 dated 21st December 2021, for the purpose of reservation of posts, the sanctioned strength for a State Educational Institution or a class of State Educational Institutions under the control of an authority or management that is competent for recruitment in those State Educational Institutions shall be regarded as a single unit. Accordingly, the roster is calculated by considering the University as a single unit.
2. The rules of reservation for SC, ST, BC, EWS (vertical) and horizontal reservation for Women, Ex-Servicemen, meritorious Sports Persons, and Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PBDs) shall be followed as per G.O. Ms. No. 77 dated 02.08.2023 issued by GAD, Government of Andhra Pradesh, and its subsequent amendments.
3. Candidates applying for reserved posts must clearly state the category to which they belong. They must also enclose a Certificate (caste) issued by a Tahsildar/Mandal Revenue Officer or other Authorised Authority as proof to this effect; failing which, the application will not be considered.

The eligibility of applicants against the post applied for shall be verified by the respective departmental committees of the Universities as per Clause 1.2 of G.O. Ms. No. 20, HE(UE) Department, dated 28.06.2023.

1. The list of prima facie eligible candidates for the screening/written test, and the list of prima facie ineligible candidates, shall be communicated to the candidates through the candidate's account on the Common Recruitment Portal and/or the candidate's registered email. The said lists may additionally be displayed on the websites of the Universities for general information.
2. Candidates who have a grievance against ineligibility shall appeal in writing to the Vice-Chancellor of the University via the Recruitment Portal only within seven (07) days from the date of display of the list.
3. The appeal of a candidate shall be adjudicated by the Vice-Chancellor of the University within seven days from the date of receipt, and the Vice-Chancellor's decision shall be final.
4. Accordingly, the final list of prima facie eligible candidates for the screening/written test shall be displayed on the University website.
5. The screening/written test shall be conducted by the APPSC.

9. Each question carries 3 marks and there shall be 1 negative mark for a wrong answer.
10. The qualifying mark in the screening/written test shall be 30% for SC/ST/PBDs; 35% for OBC; and 40% for General Category candidates. There shall be no further relaxation for any sub-category.
11. The APPSC shall publish answer key(s) for the question paper(s) on its website after conduct of the examination. Candidates who have any objections with regard to the key/questions shall file objections within three days of publication of the key, in the prescribed proforma available on the website.
12. The objections received, if any, shall be examined and the decision of APPSC in this regard shall be final. Any objection filed after the expiry of the specified time shall not be entertained.

19. The validated scores of the candidates in the order of merit, and the list of shortlisted candidates for interview, shall be displayed on the respective University website.

The final selection to the post of Assistant Professor is based solely on the candidate's performance in the interview.

27. Recommended List and Waitlist

On conclusion of the interviews, the Selection Committee shall prepare two lists in respect of each subject and each reservation category:

- i. Recommended List in the order of merit, equal in number to the notified vacancies, reservation-category-wise.
 - a) A Waitlist in the order of merit, comprising those candidates from the 4:1 interview shortlist, reservation-category-wise, who have not been accommodated in the Recommended List.
 - b) The candidates in the Recommended List shall be offered appointment, through the candidate's account on the Common Recruitment Portal, in the order of merit.
- ii. Operation of the Waitlist shall arise on:
 - a) Refusal or relinquishment by a candidate in the Recommended List to accept appointment within the prescribed period and communicated by the candidate through the online Portal in the prescribed proforma;

28. Regarding Contractual Faculty

Ms. No. 29, Higher Education (UE) Department, dated 14.05.2026, a weightage of 0.5% (zero point five percent) of the total marks of the written test conducted by the Andhra Pradesh Public Service Commission shall be applied to the marks obtained by the candidate in the said written test, for each completed year of eligible contractual service, subject to a maximum of ten (10) years.
- c. The weightage prescribed above shall apply only where the candidate has independently met the minimum qualifying marks prescribed for his/her category in the written test. The weightage shall not, under any circumstance, operate to enable a candidate to cross the said qualifying threshold. Where a candidate fails to independently meet the qualifying marks, the candidate shall not be entitled to the weightage and shall not be considered for further stages of the recruitment process.

16. Candidates who have been awarded Ph.D./Master's/Bachelor's degrees from foreign Universities must enclose an 'Equivalence Certificate' issued by the Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi; failing which, their degrees shall not be considered.
17. The University shall not be responsible for any loss of e-mail or any communication due to a wrong address provided by the candidate, or an unsuccessful transaction through the Payment Gateway.
18. Interviews for candidates who are abroad and unable to appear in person may be conducted, at no risk to the University, through video-conferencing by suitably adapting the four components of the interview

process and the time limits mentioned. If selected, he/she shall be issued a 'Letter of Intimation' of selection and shall be directed to meet the Registrar in person, on or before a stipulated date, for verification of the claims made in the application with original certificates and other documents. If the claims are found correct, the appointment order shall be issued. However, any mismatch/distortion of information found shall disqualify the candidate, and the Letter of Intimation issued shall be treated as withdrawn without any notice. No appeal shall be entertained at this stage by the University.
